How's your "Chirp" this week?

On Sunday, the homework was to "Check your Chirp". How's it going?

Cynicism is the antithesis and antidote to living in the Kingdom of God, and there's plenty of cynicism out there. It's what keeps us from seeing what Jesus described to Nathanael in John chapter 1: "You will see greater things than these. You will see heaven open, and the angels of God ascending and descending on the Son of Man." His words capture something beautiful about the way that our eyes can be opened by God when we are converted from our cynicism into faith in the reality of God's kingdom. We too can see heaven open when we look at the world through the eyes of faith.

This Sunday we will continue to delve deeply into another great and ancient story, that of Jonah and the Fish.
