A Message from Your Rector

Dear Friends in Christ,

We are called to follow Jesus. Simple, yet not simplistic. One key to our pursuit of the Jesus Way is the approach we take in our everyday lives in regards to our vocation. Key to our understanding of how we participate in the missio Dei - God's mission for the recreation of the world – is that each one of us is called by God to serve in a particular and unique way, to build-up the kingdom of God in the world for the good of the world. After all, we are called to be the hands, feet and heart of God. And at the center of this Anglican sacramental tradition lies the conviction that God loves the world. God chooses to make God's very self known to us through created matter: the matter of bread and wine, water and oil, and, of course, in Jesus, God with us. But God also selfdiscloses in the created matter of our lives-our families, work, parish, schools, and neighborhoods. We connect to God through the other created beings in the world, for as we love one another, says Scripture, we love God. This is where vocation comes in.

Vocation is a strong aptitude towards something that feels more like a call on your life than a job. It can be a career, but rarely is it something one does just for a paycheck or employment. As Margaret, a character in Gail Godwin's novel *Evensong* points out, "Something is your vocation if it keeps making more of you." Vocation calls us out of ourselves to something more, something beyond ourselves. Vocational ministry is naturally geared towards the other. Self-transformation however is but one result of this kind of ministry.

Vocational ministry then is the work of being attentive to and aware of the spiritual possibilities in what you are already doing. It is quite simply the work of being aware of the burning bushes all around you and making it your mission to help others see the burning bushes, too. God will show up in whatever you do in God's name, whether that's accounting, teaching, bus driving or preaching. God is already in it, no matter what it is. It's our 'job' to be attentive to the fact that what we do is holy work when we do it for the good of the world in God's name. Simple, yet not simplistic.

## Fun Fact!

This Sunday, the Sixth Sunday of Easter, is also Rogation Sunday! Rogation Sunday is the day when the Church traditionally offers prayer for God's blessings on the fruits of the earth and the labors of those who produce our food. The word "rogation" is from the Latin *rogare*, meaning "to ask." Historically, the Rogation Days (the three days before Ascension Day) were a period of fasting and abstinence, beseeching God's blessing on the crops for a bountiful harvest. A prayer for Rogation Day is found on pg. 258 in **The Book of Common Prayer**.
